You must call the Sheriff at 726-7701 prior to burning with the date and location. **Recycling Center:** is located at 16306 165th Ave. open the <u>1st & 3rd Saturday of each month from 8:00 am to 1:00pm</u> excluding holidays and deer-hunting opener. The Center accepts plastics, metal, glass, paper, cardboard and brush. Appliances are accepted with a fee.

Proposed rail yard 🟁

Earlier this year, Progressive Rail proposed the construction of a rail yard in the corridor from County Highway S to 105th Avenue. They requested closure of 95th Avenue, which was denied by the Comprehensive Planning Commission. Progressive Rail also proposed the construction of an overpass on 95th Avenue. Prior to any further discussion on leaving 95th Avenue as is, closing it, or allowing the construction of an overpass on 95th Avenue or County Highway S, the town and county agreed to have a Traffic Impact Analysis completed on both roads. The study was necessary to determine the impact of overpasses at either location with regard to cost, farmland loss, traffic patterns, safety and other issues. This analysis was scheduled to be completed in early September 2015. As of July 20, Progressive Rail has stopped all work on the Traffic Impact Analysis. At this time Progressive Rail has not made any public statements regarding the termination of the study, or what their intentions are for any further development.

Emergency vehicle access

The Eagle Point Volunteer Fire Department and the Town Board remind town residents that property owners need to provide proper access for emergency vehicles (fire trucks, ambulances) in the event they need to come to your home or business. Proper access means a twelve-foot wide maintained roadway and vertical and horizontal clearance of fourteen feet that is clear of brush, trees and other obstacles.

The snowplowing season – it's coming again soon 🚟

The town receives complaints from time to time that the town plow has scraped the lawn at the edge of the road. Property owners are reminded that these areas may be subjected to damage when snow needs to be pushed into the right-of-way to widen roads in preparation of the next snowfall. In addition, in situations where there is no ditch and the lawn in the town right-of-way is higher than the road surface, the lawns will likely be subjected to damage during the winter season. Another reminder – it is important for property owners to know that it is unlawful and dangerous to plow or push snow onto a town road or public highway.

Improving Residential & Business Sites



Property owners are reminded that Section 70-128 of the County Zoning Ordinance prohibits the storage of inoperative motors vehicles and abandoned equipment including such household items as old appliances and furniture outside of a building structure for more than 30 days. The town receives complaints from time to time on "junky" yards and reminds property owners, including those with rental properties and businesses, to clean up your property if this applies to you. A well-kept property benefits your neighborhood and the town as a whole. And, thanks to the property owners who strive to keep their yards and businesses in tip-top shape.



The town's dog ordinance requires that all dogs be on a leash if off the owner's property. Also, continual barking by dogs to the point of causing a public nuisance is prohibited.
