




- The Eagle Point Volunteer Fire
 Department operates out of a 3,000
 square foot space that is part of the fire station/shop facility constructed in 1978
 when Eagle Point was a member of the Chippewa Fire District.
- In the early years, the fire station housed a main engine, two tenders, a brush truck, and a portable pump.
- The current station houses the main engine, two tenders, a rescue squad, brush truck, John Deere tracked UTV, rescue boat, towable/portable pump, and numerous other pieces of portable equipment.

- The current station includes three apparatus bays, office, unisex restroom, and mechanical room and storage mezzanine.
- No major remodeling of the existing station has occurred since the original construction.
 Energy retrofits and a remodeling of the existing restroom were completed in recent years.



- The original fire station was designed with three bays. Current space needs require that the equipment be stored in four rows that are served by three overhead doors.
- Equipment must be backed into the three bays from Highway 124.
- When space is needed for meetings or training, equipment needs to be stored outside or offsite.






Fire Station Space Needs

- Fire station design standards recommend 18 footwide bays and no less than 14 feet in width.
- Parking equipment in four rows results in four bays only 10' 6" in width.

Fire Station Space Needs

 Current lack of space leaves little if any room between apparatus and stationery equipment.



 With no formal meeting room, meetings and trainings are typically conducted in an apparatus bay. A formal meeting room would provide proper heat and ventilation, seating space with tables, proper audiovisual equipment, and easy access to apparatus and equipment during trainings.
